



Stallion Service Auction Terms & Conditions

The highest bidder shall be the buyer. If any dispute arises between bidders, the Auctioneer reserves the right to recognize the party from whom he took the highest bid.

Stallion owners must list their stallion at their Nationally Advertised Breeding Fee; Contract will not be accepted otherwise. The starting bid on the stallion must be at least 50% of the nationally advertised breeding fee or \$200 whichever is greater. Private Treaty breeding fees will start out with a minimum bid of \$300. There will be a \$50 processing fee added to each accepted offer.

No Chute Fees are allowed on any donated breeding.

To be eligible to use these services, the mare must be registered with APHA, AQHA or the Jockey Club, as well as halter broke and in healthy and sound breeding condition.

Services sold are for the 2008 breeding season. Live foal guaranteed only to the extent of one return breeding in the following year to the same mare, or substitute mare in case of mare becoming unsound for breeding.

Payment shall be in cash or check paid in full immediately following purchase of service. No money will be refunded for any reason from the Southern Indiana Paint Horse Club Stallion Service Auction. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

Unsold Stallion Services may be purchased until May 31, 2008 or as long as service is in accordance with the stallion owner's breeding schedule, payable in full to SIPHC when sold.

All stallion and mare owners must mail in their entry to the Stallion Service Committee with the name of the stallion and mare, foaling date, and the sex of the foal. The entry must be postmarked no later than 14 days prior to the futurity show date, of the year foaled. If not postmarked by 14 days prior to the futurity show date, you will receive **NO ENTRY** in the Stallion Service Futurity. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

If donated Stallion Service sells in auction, then any of his weanling offspring may participate in the Stallion Service Futurity Classes with entry being \$100. Those entries must be submitted by set entry date of the year foaled, as well. **NO EXCEPTIONS.** If said stallion does not sell in the auction, then the stallion owner has the privilege of "buying back" the service for \$100 with one weanling entry in the Stallion Service Futurity Class. No other offspring are eligible if "bought back" at the \$100 fee.

Stallion Owner(s) Responsibilities:

All stallion owners will understand that his/her stallion's service must sell in order to be eligible for Stallion Service Auction Futurity. Stallion owners must list their stallion at their Nationally Advertised Breeding Fee; Contract will not be accepted otherwise. Stallion owners are required to list detailed fees when offering cooled transported shipped semen

Stallion owners agree to breed mare in a manner consistent with their present breeding program, unless an alternative method agreeable to mare owner. Furnish mare owner with breeder's certificate upon arrival of foal depending on all stallion auction fees are paid in full. It is the stallion owner's responsibility to collect board and any other associated fees from mare owner at the time of service.

Stallion owner will not be held responsible for any accidental injury and /or death to the mare or to the mare and foal.

Mare Owner(s) Responsibilities:

The mare owner upon successful completion of bid and payment may be required to sign the stallion owner(s) regular breeding contract and charges as specified. The Southern Indiana Paint Horse Club acts only as an agent for the sale of the breeding fee. All discrepancies between the stallion owner and mare owner are the responsibility of those individuals.

Mare owner will be responsible for all board fees, vet fees, transportation costs and any other fees which may occur at the discretion of the stallion owner. Mare must be in a healthy and sound breeding condition as well as halter broke. The mare must be registered with APHA, AQHA, or the Jockey Club. The mare owner must contact the stallion owner prior to the mare's arrival at the breeding facility. Upon arrival, the mare owner must present to the stallion owner a photocopy of registration papers.

Mare owner will not hold the stallion owner or Southern Indiana Paint Horse Club responsible for any accident, injury or death of the mare, and /or mare and foal. And Agree to all stipulations of the stallion owner's breeding contract.
